The Negative Effects of Alcohol Consumption are Undisputable...

1) *Alcohol is Responsible for:*

- **50 percent of all auto fatalities**
- **80 percent of all home violence**
- **30 percent of all suicides**
- **60 percent of all child abuse**
- **65 percent of all drownings**

2) *Children and Alcohol*

- **500,000 children 9-12 are addicted to alcohol**
- **6.6M children under 18 live with at least one alcoholic parent**
- **80% of HS seniors have used alcohol**
- **62% of HS seniors have been drunk**

3) *Statistics Are Overwhelming*

- **Over 70% of the people in this country drink.**
- **Over 40 million are known alcoholics.**
- **One out of seven who take their first drink becomes an alcoholic.**

Unmistakably clear warnings concerning the dangers of intoxicating beverages:

- Deceptive – goes down smooth but bites like a serpent and stings like a viper
- Wounds of unknown origin
- See strange things
- Say evil things
- Tossed about as if on the top of a ship's mast
- Feel no pain
- Addictive – even after all of this a desire for more

²⁰ Wine *is* a mocker, Strong drink *is* a brawler,
And whoever is led astray by it is not wise.

New King James Version (NKJV)

- Wine treats one with contempt, ridicule and scorn
- Strong drink is quarrelsome and wrangles
- The unwise are led astray by them
- **When is one lead astray?**

14 Do not set foot on the path of the wicked or walk in the way of evildoers. 15 Avoid it, do not travel on it; turn from it and go on your way.

New International Version (NIV)

- When is one lead astray?
 - When we **set foot on the path leading to wickedness** or **walk in the way of evildoers**
- Instead what are we to do?
 - **Avoid it, do not travel on it, turn from it an go on your way**

And Yet...

- Some in the church today claim to justify the consumption of beer, wine and mixed drinks from the scriptures
- They are concluding, in their own words, that **“all one must do is to avoid sin, ie. drunkenness”**
- How are they attempting to reach this conclusion?

Assertions allegedly authorizing the consumption of intoxicating beverages...

- “Wine drinking in the scriptures is shown in both a positive and negative light.”
- “There is no “don’t drink” passage in the scriptures.”
- “The only prohibition in scriptures is the sin of drunkenness.”
- “Christ himself made wine for consumption at the wedding in Cana of Galilee.”
- “Deacons were instructed to not drink “much” wine, so moderate drinking is ok.”

THE CHRISTIAN AND INTOXICATING BEVERAGES

Are we seeking to answer
the right question?

Let's first look for the BEST question to be answered...

- **Can a Christian drink intoxicating beverages?**

“If anyone speaks, *let him speak* as the oracles of God.” I Peter 4:11

Determining one's authority to participate is a **VERY GOOD** question.

- **Should a Christian drink intoxicating beverages?**

“But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to stumble, it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were thrown into the sea.” Mark 9:42

Also considering impacts beyond oneself is an even **BETTER** question.

- **Where did Jesus set the bar for the attitude, behavior and conduct of a Christian regarding intoxicating beverages?**

“**But I say unto you...**” Matt 5:22, 28, 32, 34, 39 & 44

Determining how we should follow the life and instruction of our Savior as laid out in the scriptures is the **VERY BEST** approach.

Jesus laid out clear examples of His “higher standard” in the Kingdom of God in Matthew 5

²¹ ‘YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT MURDER’ and ‘Whoever commits murder shall be liable to the court.’

²² **But I say to you** that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be guilty before the court;

²⁷ ‘YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY’;

²⁸ **But I say to you** that everyone who looks at a woman with lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

³¹ ‘WHOEVER SENDS HIS WIFE AWAY, LET HIM GIVE HER A CERTIFICATE OF DIVORCE’;

³² **But I say to you** that everyone who divorces his wife, except for *the* reason of unchastity, makes her commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

Medicinal Properties of Ethyl Alcohol

- **Antiseptic** – disinfects and sterilizes
- **Anesthetic** – dulls the sense of pain

The effects of alcohol intoxication are greatly influenced by individual variations among users. Some users may become intoxicated at a much lower Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) level than is shown.

- 0.02-0.03 BAC: No loss of coordination, slight euphoria and loss of shyness. Depressant effects are not apparent.
- 0.04-0.06 BAC: Feeling of well-being, relaxation, lower inhibitions, sensation of warmth. Euphoria. Some minor impairment of reasoning and memory, lowering of caution.
- 0.07-0.09 BAC: Slight impairment of balance, speech, vision, reaction time, and hearing. Euphoria. Judgement and self- control are reduced, and caution, reason and memory are impaired.
- 0.10-0.125 BAC: Significant impairment of motor coordination and loss of good judgement. Speech may be slurred; balance, vision, reaction time and hearing will be impaired. Euphoria. It is illegal to operate a motor vehicle at this level of intoxication.
- 0.13-0.15 BAC: Gross motor impairment and lack of physical control. Blurred vision and major loss of balance. Euphoria is reduced and dysphoria is beginning to appear.
- 0.16-0.20 BAC: Dysphoria (anxiety, restlessness) predominates, nausea may appear. The drinker has the appearance of a "sloppy drunk."
- 0.25 BAC: Needs assistance in walking; total mental confusion. Dysphoria with nausea and some vomiting.
- 0.30 BAC: Loss of consciousness.
- 0.40 BAC and up: Onset of coma, possible death due to respiratory arrest.

How does one...

- Maintain self-control when the first serving lessens self-control
- Use caution to control the amount of drinking when drinking lowers inhibitions and caution?
- Stay on the alert for our adversary the devil when reasoning and judgment are impaired?

Who's being a "legalist"?

Those who justify their drinking because there is no explicit, verbatim "don't drink" verse in the Bible

-OR-

Those who recognize and abide by Jesus' entire higher standard described in the scriptures and choose to abstain from intoxicating beverages

Conclusion:

Although we may not find an explicit, verbatim “don’t drink” statement in the scriptures...

- Jesus clearly sets out in scripture a much higher standard of attitude, behavior and conduct for a Christian
- The only choice for a Christian to meet this standard is to abstain from intoxicating beverages of today (beer, wine & mixed drinks) (non-medicinal)
- Considering Jesus’ instruction regarding His higher standard, why would a Christian **demand** a “don’t drink” statement in order to abstain?
- Considering Jesus’ instructions, on the day of judgment do I want to hang my eternal destination on a justification of “**You did not explicitly say not to**”?
